40 Years and Counting

On July 7, 1982, Ybor City Museum Society (YCMS) was incorporated by a group of dedicated volunteers who were passionate about preserving and sharing the unique story of Ybor City. The growth of the cigar industry at the turn of the 20th century, along with the unprecedented immigration from various countries including Spain, Cuba, Sicily, Romania, and Germany, led to the distinctive cultural diversity of Ybor City and Tampa, which is still evident today.

From its inception, YCMS has strived to preserve Ybor City's rich and diverse culture by serving as a Citizen Support Organization (CSO) for the Ybor City Museum State Park and building the Tampa Baseball Museum at the Al Lopez House. Through


creative and educational exhibits and programs, YCMS offers the community a connection to the past and the people and events who helped usher in the era of “modern Tampa.”

We are proud to be a part of our National Historic Landmark District and Tampa Bay’s cultural community. Thank you to our members, donors, grantors, park staff, volunteers, and many others who have supported our organization in so many ways.

Photo is of Rafael Martinez-Ybor next to the bust of his great-grandfather, Vicente Martinez-Ybor. Rafael was instrumental in working with the state to preserve the Ferlita Bakery so it could become a museum. A plaque was added in 2019 to commemorate Rafael's four decades of service to our organization.

The Ferlita Bakery

Francisco Ferlita immigrated to Tampa from Santo Stefano, Sicily, and opened his first bakery, known as “La Joven Francesa”, in 1896. The original wooden building was destroyed by fire in 1922, leaving only the brick oven intact. In 1923 the bakery was rebuilt incorporating the original oven and adding another. It became fully operational in 1924. With a daily production of 300-500 loaves, Ferlita would deliver Cuban bread to his customers and hang the bread on long nails installed on door frames.



His sons carried on the tradition until the bakery closed in 1973. In 1974, the Metropolitan Development Agency acquired the bakery from the Ferlita family. After receiving approval from the City of Tampa, the mayor, and the Land Acquisition Trust Fund, the building was purchased in 1975 by the State Department of Natural Resources. Two adjacent tracts of land were also purchased from Hillsborough Community College Trustees.

With the help of a grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Ferlita building was converted to a museum and state funds paid for the design of the adjacent museum garden. The brick ovens were kept intact, to provide visitors with a unique glimpse into Ybor City’s history. The Ybor City Museum State Park opened in 1980 and has since showcased exhibits on the founding of Ybor City and its early history.
