



Join us for an intriguing evening in the Centro's ornate and historic theatre for this short film featuring Tampa locals. The screening will be followed by a Q&A with Argeo, who resides in Asturias, Spain, as well as local experts on Spanish immigration. The J.C. Newman Cigar Company broke ground on November 18, 2022 for their new Cigar Workers Park. Located across the street from the their cigar factory, with its iconic clock tower "El Reloj", the park will include bat houses, where a colony of 3000 bats will be moved from their current location at the nearby Sanchez y Haya Building. According to

the Newman Family, "Ybor City lacks public space -- green space for residents and visitors alike to be able to gather and enjoy nature. By building this 8,400-square-foot park, our hopes are to show the connection of cigars to nature and do our part to improve and beautify Ybor City for nearby residents and visitors alike."
