Honoring A Hero

Salvador Martinez-Ybor, Jr., the grandson of Ybor City founder, Vicente Martinez-Ybor, proved to be a hero among men. He was born to Salvador Martinez-Ybor, Sr. and Consuela Pou in 1910 and raised in Ybor City with his brother, Ignacio, Sr. before moving to Cuba in the 1930s.



After the bombing of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, Salvador left his affluent life in Cuba to fight for the country he loved by enlisting in the U.S. Army. In January of 1945, he was killed in action, making the Martinez-Ybor family a Gold Star family.

Salvador's purple heart has been donated to the Ybor City Museum Society in loving memory by his nephew, Ignacio Martinez-Ybor, Jr. Join us in the garden of the Ybor City Museum State Park on December 7, 2022, 1:00 pm as we honor this hero, among others.

Florida State Senator Jay Collins and Tampa City Councilman Luis Viera are among the speakers for the dedication. Collins is a purple heart recipient and Viera liaised with Ignacio Martinez-Ybor, Jr. to arrange the donation of the medal to the Society. Pearl Harbor Day was selected for this solemn and inspiring program as a reminder of the sacrifices our fallen heroes have made for our country.

Two additional programs in the series will be presented on December 8 and December 9 at Centro Asturiano de Tampa and El Centro Español de Tampa, respectively. These historic buildings in Ybor City and West Tampa were built more than a century ago to serve as Spanish social clubs and mutual aid societies. The events are free and open to the
