

In 2014, Spanish filmmaker and journalist, Luis Argeo, and NYU professor, Dr. James Fernandez, created this film as a stark reminder of the precarious legacy that has been left to us by the Spanish presence in Tampa. Join us for an intriguing evening in the Centro's ornate and historic theatre for this short film featuring Tampa locals. The critically acclaimed film debuted in Tampa and has since been featured at international film festivals, among many other locations in the USA and Spain. The screening will be followed by a Q&A with Argeo, who resides in Asturias, Spain, as well as local experts on Spanish immigration.
